Hello Alex - It's come to our attention that you are advertising a Summer Wilderness Youth Program set for July 14th to 18th in Kejimikujik National Park and National Historic Site. As I've stated in a previous email and through our phone conversation on March 12th, your company is required to have a valid Business Licence to operate within any National Park. Through some inquiries, I've learned that you do not have a Business Licence with Kejimikujik NP & NHS. Our National Office is currently reviewing our policies regarding the issuing of Business Licences to Guiding companies and individuals. On top of this, we already have a licensed guiding operation in the park. We'd be hard pressed to justify issuing another to a competing company in a park this size. So Ukalik procuring a Business Licence prior to July 14th is not realistic. The only way this program would be allowed to go ahead is if you were contracted by Keji Outfitters to undertake the trip. You can find their contact information online.

Please remove all advertising you have for this event, from all platforms, and from all outlets. I can see through our reservation system that you have not booked any sites for this excursion. Please don't attempt to, as we will not issue valid camping permits for your stay. And camping without valid permits is illegal.
